CHOOSE

What can I choose from?

There are many options when it comes to wheeled mobility devices. Here are some key features to consider when choosing a wheelchair, stroller or scooter:

Self-propelled or Transit	Mobility devices can either be moved by the user (self-propelled) or by someone behind or beside them (transit).
Method of propulsion	Mobility devices can be moved in different ways. Wheelchairs can be set up so that people can move them using their arms, feet, one hand, one finger, head movements and other control options.
Basic / Scripted	"Scripted" or "custom" wheelchairs have a much wider range of sizes, configurations and accessories that can be added to them.
Seating functions	You can select a seat that tilts, rotates, raises up or down, or helps you to stand up.
Specialised seating	Special cushions, backrests, harnesses and more can help you to be more stable and comfortable.
Transport approval	Wheelchairs, strollers and scooters are usually intended to be used as a seat in a car or other vehicle. If you need to stay seated in your wheelchair or stroller, you will need to make sure your mobility device is crash-tested and transport-approved.
